For Your Additional Protection

Based on some wise feedback from some members of the congregation, the trustees are in the process of researching how best to install Plexiglas barriers on the podiums in the sanctuary. This will allow DJ to sing and Pastor Michelle to preach without having to wear masks. Masks are especially restrictive to singers and public speakers since they diminish sound quality and restrict facial movement. In addition, communication by facial expression is almost nonexistent when wearing a mask. With that said, it may take some time for the trustees to make alterations to the worship space. Until that time, DJ and Pastor Michelle will continue to wear masks or face shields during all parts of the worship service.
